

President's Report

As I sit here in Southern Ontario and write the Winter Report in late February, the temperature outside is a balmy 17 degrees It releases a fresh burst of Celcius! enthusiasm that Spring might be just around the corner!



CHAA volunteers, especially in the maintenance department. The aircraft undergo their annual inspections and detail work to the insignia and aircraft markings is always a task that crew members enjoy. Although the aircraft are maintained so well throughout the flying season, there are often little surprises (or even some big ones!) that these 65-75 year old Harvards reveal when they are "undressed" in front of Shane Clayton and Kerry Wilkinson (AME). Batteries and tires seem to be the big ticket items on Shanes's shopping list this year. New radios make the list every year! Of course, we have two Harvards that need their P & W R1340's overhauled at an estimated cost of \$50,000 USD each! The Yale sits forlornly in the corner desperately wanting to "prove" herself, but corrosion in the wing attach angles prevents us from a flying program until that extensive repair work is completed. Since there are no new attach angles in existence, the new angles have to be manufactured at considerable expense (of course!). The Tiger Moth is nearly completed after a couple of years of major maintenance and we expect it to return to active duty on the flight line sometime this spring.

In late January, I attended the annual NECAS (North East Council of Air Shows) Conference in Niagara Falls, NY, along with Public Relations Director Terry Scott, COpsO Biarni Trygyasson and Chief Pilot Scott McMaster. It was a good weekend for networking with producers and performers in the air show business. Surprisingly there are not as many air shows planned in Canada in 2017 as was expected, being that it is Canada's 150th Anniversary. London, Brantford and Toronto are the only full air shows being planned at this time. There are several one day events that we hope CHAA will have some opportunity to participate in. 2018 promises to be a much bigger year and we have been talking with several show producers from

Quebec, the Maritimes and the US Northeast. CFB Trenton, St. Thomas and possibly CFB Borden are all planning events for next year. There is an overall optimism in the air show industry, although I sensed that many producers are leaning towards smaller shows with lower budgets and less risk. This is where CHAA fits in great

because we can offer a pretty significant package at a reasonable cost to events within 250 miles of Tillsonburg.

Melanie Burden has been appointed as "Air Displays Coordinator" and will be working directly with Bjarni and Scott in Flight Operations. William McDowell and Stephen **Smith** have been appointed as "Co-Flight Experience Coordinators" and will be arranging ALL backseat rides. Andrew Muhtar and Terry Scott have been spearheading a rejuvenation of the website and noticeable improvements have been made to the site. Special thanks!

The Annual Business Meeting is scheduled for Saturday, March 18 at 10:00 AM in the meeting room at Tillsonburg. Committee chairs and Directors are working on budgets for 2017. Director Mel Blundell has assumed the position of bookkeeper and the transition from the past bookkeeper has taken longer than expected. After the books are completed, they need to go to the accountant for preparation of the 2016 Annual Business Report. Typically the report is presented to the membership at the ABM, but it may be delayed until the April Members Briefing. Vacancies on the Board have been filled by Michael Lawrence and John Follows. They were appointed to the Board of Directors in February for two year terms. Other candidates are also being considered.

The mailout fund raising effort this year was short of our anticipated amounts, but we must continue looking forward. We hope that there will be a significant increase in flight experiences this season, as we plan to be in full compliance with the Transport Canada Exemption that came into effect last summer.

CHAA MEMBERS' BRIEFING January 21, 2017

Meeting called to order by President **Pat Hanna** at 1000 hrs.

Ken Mist read the minutes from the November 2016 briefing as the meeting in December was cancelled due to inclement weather. **Bruce Tapp** moved that the minutes be accepted, **Bill Long** seconded. Motion carried.

Pat updated the status of fundraising and expressed disappointment with the present status. Another appeal has been sent and encouraged everyone to give. Approximately \$20,000 is needed to get the Yale back in the air and \$70,000 each for the 2 engine rebuilds required on Harvards. Ken provided an update of the current fundraising result – approximately \$4,000.

Pat talked about CHAA's upcoming presentation at the NECAS meetings in Niagara Falls, NY. NECAS is the North East Council of Air Shows and brings together performers, organizers and service providers for the area. **Terry Scott** showed the 3-minute presentation that we will be bringing to the event. Pat, Terry and Bjarni will be representing the group.

The goal of the year is to be able to receive the exemption from Transport Canada to sell rides. Pat said selling rides is our best opportunity to gain revenue and exposure.

Shane updated the group on the status of the aircraft. Annual Harvard inspections underway without any major issues found so far. The Tiger Moth is getting closer to flying again soon. Yale attach angles show corrosion and need replacement. Shane is working with the warbird community to see if other Yale owners want to work together on sourcing these items economically.

Calendar sales resulted in a \$600 donation given by Shane to the fundraising effort.

The question was asked why we are not having the engine overhauls done in Canada. **Shane Clayton** feels that the quality of the Canadian outfit qualified to perform the work is far below that of the US firm that has done work for us in the past. Even with the current exchange rate, the economics and expected life suggest the US is still the best option.

Pat mentioned the changes at Vintage Wings of Canada and Ken provided an update from messages he has received as a member.

Jeanette is handling membership duties during this meeting. **Ralph Labusch** of Labusch Skywear gave Pat a large number of t-shirts and hats as a donation. They will be sold during meetings and events as long as stock remains.

Gord McNulty spoke to the group. CAHS will hold its Annual General Meeting in London June 8 to 11. Go to cahs.ca for more information. Breitling will be bringing its DC-3 to Canada on the way to Oshkosh. Details to follow. Vintage Wings is working on a Mk IX Spitfire.

Leonard Fallowfield, Bruce Tapp, Kip Davis and **Bill Long** were singled out as 4 of our "vintage" Harvard pilots in attendance.

Terry introduced an opportunity to have prints by **Trish McNorgan** from Winnipeg who is offering paintings of Harvards and she will put you in the painting. Contact Terry for details.

Andy Armstrong is working on a unique item for our upcoming fundraising – a specially designed graphic on a propeller blade. See http://propellerart.ca for examples of his work.

Guest speaker **Gerry Younger**, 8-time Canadian Aerobatic Champion from Guelph, was introduced and he presented an interesting slide show.

Meeting adjourned at 1145 hrs.

Canadian aerobatic legend **Gerry Younger** of Guelph was the guest speaker at the January 21st Members' Briefing. His love affair with flying began as an air cadet in England. He became interested in competitive aerobatics and won the Canadian championship several times. Gerry told CHAA members of a career highlight – qualifying for the world aerobatics



championships in Kiev in 1976. Wardair agreed to fly Gerry and his Pitts Special to Frankfurt, Germany which was a story in itself. But the real tricky part was getting from Germany to Russia. Gerry, along with American, British and European pilots followed a Russian pilot in an Antonov! Back home, he did the air show circuit and was a solo act at the CNE for a few years. For about 15 years, Gerry ran an aerobatic training school at the Region of Waterloo International Airport.

CHAA at NECAS 2017

Once again this year, CHAA was well represented at the annual North East Council of Air Shows conference at the Niagara Falls Air Reserve Station in Niagara Falls, New York. The conference, January 27 to 29, was the second best attended event in the 25 year history of NECAS.

The agenda included three-minute (max) presentations by 24 performers and, as luck would have it, CHAA was the very first out of the gate on Saturday morning. President Pat Hanna introduced our team including Bjarni Tryggvason, Scott McMaster and Terry Scott and then we ran the video produced by Terry. He spoke of helping the airshow industry survive and thrive. The guest speaker at the Saturday evening dinner was Retired U.S. Colonel Bill Goldfein whose son, David Goldfein, is a General in the USAF and currently serves as the Air Force Chief of Staff. Col. Goldfein said when he graduated high school in 1949 he joined the Navy, but soon switched to the Air Force. He had taken a flight in an SNJ (the Navy version of the Air Force T-6) and he was so impressed with flying that he knew he had to become a pilot. His 33-year Air Force career took him

to the Vietnam War, Korea, Japan, France, Germany, Thailand, England, Spain and back to the U.S. where he retired. Col. Goldfein's service included flying the F-4 with the 555th Fighter Squadron, accumulating more than 2,000 hours of flight. forms for magazines or "Guaranteed 100% Florida Oranges!" order forms for fundraising activities?


As a member of the Service Crew, I noticed immediately the difference in the smoke our Harvards produced when, at the 2015 GLIAS (the St. Thomas Airshow) we used some high quality smoke oil that was supplied by the organizers. This was the same smoke oil used by both the Snowbirds and also by local performer and air race pilot Pete McLeod at the show! I wanted to be able to have our Harvards use the same high quality oil for all of our performances, flypasts and shows regardless of whether the organizers

were able to provide it. Unfortunately, this high quality smoke oil is expensive! I certainly couldn't afford to purchase and donate on my own, a full barrel of smoke oil.

Gofundme is a service and website that allows individuals, groups and organizations to raise funds for almost any purpose. Although I'd heard of the site before, and had in fact donated to another cause through the site, I'd never researched it for myself. Once I did though, I found it to be extremely easy to upload some of my own photos and create a fundraiser using their template. It really couldn't have been easier! Write a few enthusiastic lines about what I wanted to support, set a goal, add a few photos and voila! A new fundraiser was born. I'm fairly active on the Social Media site Facebook, and I published an open call to all my friends for support and shared it to a number of organization pages, including our own CHAA Facebook page.

In less than a half hour from going "live", my campaign had its first donation! As it turned out, in less than four days, we had reached our goal of raising enough money to purchase a barrel of smoke oil! This is, to me, an amazing accomplishment and shows just how generous people within our organization (and some from outside of it too) can be. All that remains now, is to have our smoke delivered before the beginning of the season, and we will all be able to see the fruits of our efforts and generosity when our beautiful yellow ladies take to the skies again!

In 1985, way back in CHAA's early days, I don't think we ever imagined the Harvards still flying in thirty years (except for Bob Hewitt!). For thirty-one years now, we have faithfully kept to our commitment to acquire, restore, preserve, maintain, display and demonstrate our aircraft in honour of the brave aircrews of the Royal Canadian Air Force. In that regard, it is fitting our November 11th Remembrance Day flights typically close out the flying season for us.

To continue flying into 2017 and beyond, it will require a tremendous amount of funding. The Mark IV Harvards are approaching sixty-five years in service and the Mark II Harvards are now over seventy-five years old, so they require copious amounts of "TLC" to keep flying them safely. Time has caught up to two of the Harvards and they require engine overhauls, at a cost of nearly \$75,000 CDN each. Based on historical values, a freshly overhauled engine would give us over twenty-five more years of service! In essence, you are making an investment in the future by donating today!

CHAA MEMBERS' BRIEFING – February 18, 2017

Meeting called to order by President Pat Hanna at 1001 hrs.

Ken Mist read the minutes **Diane Lawrence** moved acceptance, **Cathy Cowan** seconded. Motion carried.

Pat announced that 3 new Directors have been appointed. **Mike Lawrence, John Follows** and **John Picone**. Pat will be stepping down after 16 years on the Board. (*Note: Due to a communication mix up, John Picone has since advised he is not available to serve on the board at this time.)*

Annual Banquet – **Eric Dumigan** was here and announced as our guest speaker. Signs are pointing to a full house at this year's banquet as ticket sales are going well. Andy Armstrong's beautiful propeller blade will be the highlight of the live auction. He has donated it to us so that all funds raised can go to CHAA. Pat is investigating allowing proxy and live remote bidding. Banquet date: April 22.

NECAS – Pat, Bjarni, Terry and Scott represented CHAA. A 3-minute video presentation was well received. The number of airshows in Canada is limited this year but there are some possibilities on the horizon. The focus needs to be on small fly-ins and opportunities to sell rides after April 1st.

Transport Canada exemption – Pat has asked for some clarification from TC to see if we can pre-sell rides now to be redeemed after April 1st. Still waiting to hear back from them.

Back seat coordinator **Melanie Burden** will be transitioning to Air Displays Coordinator assisting Bjarni and Scott. **Stephen Smith** and **William McDowell** will be taking over the back-seat coordination role.

Mel Blundell has been taking over the bookkeeping duties and is working on gathering the financial information. Ken provided a fundraising update. Approximately \$4,400.

Shane provided a quick update. Inspections and maintenance continue with the goal to hit the April 1st target.

We still have Labusch Skywear product available at \$5 a unit and new CHAA product is available which **Bruce Tapp** is selling after the meeting.

No new business.
