


THORNDALE EASTER EGG HUNT




Large item collection begins in Ingersoll on Monday, March 31, 2025. Pick-up dates vary by zone. See the map below to find out when your collection will occur.



ZONE 1: WEEK OF MARCH 31

ZONE 2: WEEK OF APRIL 7

ZONE 3: WEEK OF APRIL 14



Does your large item fit?

- Does your item weigh more than 45 kg (100 lbs)?
- Can it be easily broken down into a garbage bag?
- Is there another recycling program in place for this item? (see chart)
- Is your item small but you have a large quantity?

If you answered "yes" to any of the questions above, your item does NOT meet the program requirements.

This program is for large items


This is NOT a spring clean-up

Non-program material will be left behind, and the homeowner will be responsible for removing it.

Note: glass, mirrors, automotive parts and items piled on trailers/wagons or loose in cardboard boxes will not be collected.

Acceptable items

Any large item which:



- · weighs less than 100 lbs
- · is not collected through an existing recycling program (see below)

Program requirements



Set out by 7 a.m. the Monday of your collection week. Late set outs will not be collected.



Max weight for any item is 45 kg or 100 lbs.



Bag tags are not required for large items.



Place items no more than one metre from the curb.

Items must be on your property, not across roads/ditches, and easily visible (clear of tall grass).



Do not place small items on top of larger items. Inaccessible material will be left behind.



Residents are responsible for unacceptable items left behind and/or late set outs.

CANADIAN HARVARD AIRCRAFT ASSOC

The Canadian Harvard Aircraft Association (CHAA) is a remarkable gem nestled in the backyard of Oxford County. Celebrating its 40th anniversary this year, its bright yellow historical warbirds have been taking to the skies in honour & in remembrance of the servicemen who flew them during the Second World War. In 1985, three aviation enthusiasts shared a dream to create an organization that preserved the Harvard aircraft & its notable history. Today, the Canadian Harvard Aircraft Association is a registered charitable organization with 400 members, 8 Harvards and 1 Yale. Based at the Tillsonburg Regional Airport, it owns North America's largest fleet of Harvards. "Keeping these warbirds in flying condition is a colossal task," says Walther Irie, President of the Canadian Harvard Aircraft Association. "Yet our volunteers are dedicated to keeping the legacy of the Harvard alive, and preserving its historical significance," he added. Everyone volunteers at the Harvard Association, including mechanics & pilots. "We always welcome new volunteers," added Irie. "No aviation experience is required; and there are always opportunities for people to contribute & have fun." The Harvard aircraft, now more than 80 years old, was the workhorse of Canada's Second World War flight training program. It played a significant and pivotal role in the Royal Canadian Air Force as the primary advanced, single-engine aircraft used to train more than 130,000 Canadian and Allied aircrew under the British Commonwealth Air Training Plan in Canada. "The Plan" was a large-scale multinational military training program that trained pilots, navigators, gunners and engineers from around the globe. Dubbed the "pilot maker", the Harvard engine's distinctive "roar" was a familiar sound at air bases across Canada. A special 40th Anniversary Open House & Fly Day is scheduled for Sat, July 5 (rain date July 6). This family-friendly event is free to attend, although flights will be available at an additional cost. More events will be listed on CHAA's website at www.harvards.com. This organization truly embodies a deep respect for history and a passion for keeping the legacy of these aircraft, and the servicemen who flew them, alive for future generations.

"FOOD FOR ALL" - COMING SOON

I'm happy to report our hope to provide more food security to our village is much closer to reality. And now, more than ever, we know this is actually something for everyone! After a visit to the Cycles of Life warehouse & one of their community outreach tables, we now have an even clearer picture of just how much good this program can do. Not only is it offering a respectful way for people to choose the food they need, but it is doing a lot for our economy, and especially the environment - something with which we all need to be on board. It was almost overwhelming to see how much food Cycles of Life has in their warehouse, ready to stock their various community outreach tables in the county of Oxford (so far only in the more major centres, so Thamesford is breaking new ground to bring this to a community in a rural township.) Though they do use monetary donations to buy some specific foods for convenience & nutrition, most of their food comes from Second Harvest and Harvest Hands, as well as some participating grocery stores, farms, & specialty stores. So, when you see the warehouse, this is not food about to go bad, but fresh produce, eggs & dairy, frozen food and prepackaged - products you'd see in your local grocery store even COBS Bread which has made it their mandate to offer skids of bread each week! Much of this is food that would otherwise have been wasted, filling our landfills instead of hungry tummies. It was sobering & inspiring to think where it might have gone & where it was being redirected. Where is this all coming from you might ask? Well, organizations like Second Harvest and Harvest Hands have found a win-win situation by which they take what would be costly waste from those who can't sell it & redirect it to the people who can use it. For example, let's look at agriculture. When farmers plant fruits & vegetables, they have to plant more than they can sell. They may have a bad year for that product due to weather, conditions & disease. There might be others growing more & flooding the market. They may need to sell more than usual because others have decreased. There are so many variables with planting that no one would ever be able to plant exactly what's needed, so the best choice is to plant more to be ready for contingencies. But, then, at least for some of the products, there will be more than can be sold. That's where Second Harvest and Harvest Hands come in – they take those extras at no cost to the farmer & make them available to various charitable food distributors around Ontario. The same concept applies for grocery stores, and even restaurants - there will always be surpluses that need not go to waste but can be diverted to where they are helpful. This food is given a new life, and it doesn't add to our landfills. What an Easter story! New life for that which might have been thought of as dead & gone. New life for those who hunger, for those who might just need a hand up to keep their house/rent/utilities, for those concerned about our environment. So, when our table gets started, we'd like to see anyone & everyone come and take part. Even our volunteers who went to see the program came home with heads of broccoli & a huge box of quinoa. Far better this food be used than go to waste. Westminster already has a team or two in place & another team is set up from the community-at-large. St. John's Anglican and the Thamesford Lions are putting together teams. COUNCIL NEWS FROM MAYOR RYAN

The Oxford County bag tag program for garbage had 2 initial purposes. One was to encourage diversion which is better for the environment, and would save us all money by delaying the cost of a new landfill (a starting point of a minimum of \$40M). The other was to give residents a measure of control over their own costs of waste. A user pay system is inherently more fair. Oxford County does not operate the service, we award a contract based on a public competitive bidding process to get the best options & best price. The cost of curbside garbage collection has increased with population growth & increases in fuel and inflation in general since the price was set at \$2 in 2014. Bag tags cover the entire cost of waste (garbage, recycling, and in 2027 green bin) collection. Elimination of bag tags entirely would mean a 5.5% tax increase to pay the cost of the collection. This means that it would be an approximately 1.8% tax increase to keep the bag tag at \$2. Either way, there is a bill to be paid. There is no such thing as a "free bag". My preference is always the lowest bill, and the one that gives people the most control over their bill. So Oxford Council considered all of this & as a result, the price of garbage bag tags will increase to \$3 effective Jan 1, 2026, the first increase since 2014. Oxford County Council gave careful consideration to the different alternatives for curbside waste collection & supported the best option and pricing available through a competitive process. There is a cost to collect waste & it must be paid. At the end of the day, our waste collection program continues to offer great value for the level of service that is being provided to residents, in many cases for less than the cost of food delivery to your home. With the new organics program rolling out in Oxford, something residents have long asked for, we should also see fewer bags of garbage being set out at the curb. This is the end goal: extending the service life of our landfill, to save us all money, and delaying the need for a new one as stewards of our natural environment. An independent audit of curbside garbage in Oxford County in 2021 found that on average more than half of the weight of individual garbage bags was made up of organic material. Curbside collection for organics will start in May 2027. With the increase in bag tag fees, but a change to a 6 day collection cycle & green bins in 2027, it is entirely likely that while we will all pay more for an individual tag, we pay may the same or less for a year's worth of tags because we'll need fewer. I'm confident I couldn't get a business to come & get my garbage every week for \$3.

In response to direction from Zorra council staff have recommended several policy changes that will allow the Township to prioritize Canadian goods & services over American. This is not simple as we are legally bound by treaties & trade deals. I am also working with the Western Ontario Wardens Caucus to get the Provincial & Federal governments to give municipalities increased legal ability to prioritize Canadian goods & services over American. I've had a few people on social media push back against municipalities or Canada fighting back against tariffs & the USA. They argue that we're too small to make a difference, that nothing can be done. We MUST push back. Our very sovereignty depends on it. We are a small country by population but that has never stopped us: Vimy, D-Day, Korea, UN Peacekeepers was a Canadian idea, 9/11, etc. Zorra is a small municipality by population but that has never stopped us: keeping schools open, stopping landfills, stopping the wasteful High Speed Rail, redeveloping abandoned industrial land to slow sprawl, unprecendented collaboration with TVDSB to get a new school, renewable energy buildings that reduce our tax costs, etc. Sometimes you just do it because it's the right thing to do. #Canada #elbowsup #buyCanadian #shoplocal #doingourpart #growingstrongertogether #never51 #11thprovince #Canadaisnotforsale As always, feel free to contact me on any issue: Marcus Ryan, Mayor, Zorra Township (and Warden, Oxford County), mryan@zorra.ca, 519-425-2338.
